

## Planning for Practice Dice

### **Achievement Objective**

Technological Practice - Planning for Practice - Level 3

*Undertake planning to identify the key stages and resources required to develop an outcome. Revisit planning to include reviews of progress and identify implications for subsequent decision making.*

### **Learning Intention**

I am learning... discuss and review the stakeholders, resources and key stages in the development of my outcome.

### **Activity Instructions**

1. Teacher/students create dice from examples below.
2. Students in pairs or small groups use dice to discuss their planning for practice.
3. Students roll the dice and each answers the questions shown.
4. Students could then review their recorded practice to date and make possible changes (use different colour pen to identify changes made)

### **Teacher Notes**

- Encourage students to create their own questions for each other.
- Dice questions could also be aligned around questions relevant to Brief development, Planning for Practice, and Outcome Development & Evaluation.
- Key with this activity is to have a discussion first, before encouraging recording / review of recorded information.
